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## Countable and Uncountable nouns

- Nouns can be of two types—**countable** and **uncountable**.
- **Countable nouns** refer to things we can count. They have a singular and a plural form.  
For example:

*one cat – two cats*

*one shop – many shops*

**Uncountable nouns** stand for things we cannot count. They may be the names of ideas, feelings, qualities, or other uncountable things. They usually do not have a plural form. For example:

*happiness    wisdom    air    sugar*
