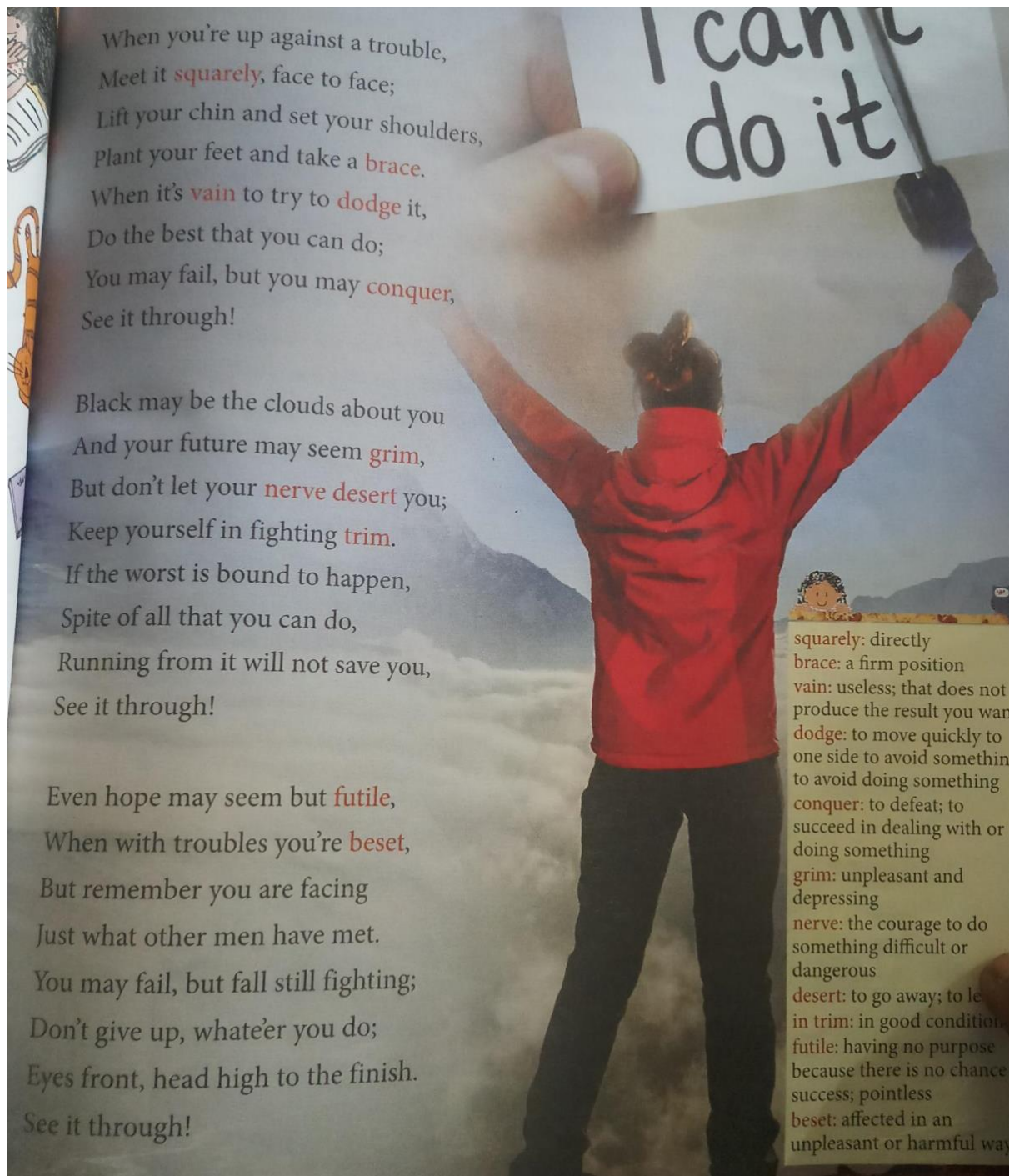
Read, write and remember the present poem.

desert: to go away; to leave
in trim: in good condition
futile: having no purpose because there is no chance of success; pointless
beset: affected in an unpleasant or harmful way
