## Pronoun

Pronoun:- A pronoun is a word that takes place of one or more nouns and it must match the noun it refers to. I, you, he, she, it, me, him and her are singular pronouns and we, you, they, us, and them are plural forms.

Subject Pronoun:- Here the pronoun is used as the subject of the sentence.

e.g:- Shekhar is a good cricketer. He has represented his school in many national tournaments.

Here, He replaces " shekhar" who is the subject in the above sentence; hence he is a subject.

I, you, he, she, it, we and they are subject pronouns.

Object pronouns:- Here the pronoun is used after an action verb or after a word such as for, at, of with or to.

example:- Are you coming with me or going with him?

In the above sentence, " me and him" are the object pronoun.

Reflexive Pronoun:- When instead of object pronoun if the subject of the sentence is doing the action to himself, it uses a reflexive pronoun.

Myself, Yourself, herself, himself, itself, ourselves, themselves and yourselves are the reflexive pronouns.
