## Correct Use of shall and will

Mark the force of shall and will in the following sentences

1. You **shall** be rewarded. [= I am resolved to have you rewarded.]

2 He **shall** be rewarded. [= I am resolved to have him rewarded.]

3. I **will** not be able to go to office today. [This is incorrect, for it expresses the determination or will of the speaker. Use 'shall instead of 'will'.]

4 I **will** be happy to do so. ['Happy' here implies 'willingness', and to say 'I will be happy' is like saying, I will be willing'. This is absurd. Say, therefore, I shall be happy.

5. I **will** have much pleasure in accepting your kind invitation. [The

sentence as it stands implies an effort of will on the part of the speaker to feel pleasure. This is absurd. Say, 'I shall have...
