Why do we study the past?

- We study the past to understand how & why our early ancestors lived. The story of our past tells how agriculture,
- Irrigation & animal husbandry began & how it led settled life.
- To study history, we come to know about great kings/queens.
- Studying history helps us to understand how beliefs & ideas came into being and influenced the course of history.
- An expert who studies archaeology, which is the science of exploring and excavating old ruins, and studying them.

Dates in history

In history, you see dates written as BC or AD. BC stands for Before Christ or the number of years before Jesus Christ. AD

Stands for Anno Domini or 'in the year of our Lord's. The date of birth of Christ is taken as 1 AD which is 2000 years ago. Therefore, the date 650 BC means 2000+650=2650 years ago.

Now, historians use BCE and CE in place of BC and AD, respectively. BCE stands for Before Common Era; CE stands for Common Era. The dates in BCE are always counted backwards.

This means that 80 BCE comes after 90 BCE. Dates before the year 1 CE are indicated by the use of BCE.
