DIRECT AND INDIRECT SPEECH

in this last chapter, we shall talk about how to say the same thing in different ways. Here we shall see how we can report others' statement without any change in meaning.

Look at the following:

Rajesh said, "I am glad to be here." Rajesh said that he was glad to be there.

The first sentence puts down the statement made by Rajesh'. The second sentence is also the same but it is reported by somebody else.

When we put somebody's expression in inverted commas, it is called Direct Speech.

When somebody's expression is put in our own words it is called Indirect Speech. As it is reported by others, it is also called Reported Speech.
