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Homophones

Homophones are words that are pronounced the same as another word, but has a different meaning or spelling, or both. For example:

I gave two pens to Shreya. I gave her a book too.

Our English class lasted an hour. I would like to order a chair made of wood.

In these sentences, two, to, too/ our, hour/ would, wood are homophones.

Since homophones are pronounced the

same way, we must be careful with their spellings.
