Their food on plants are known as consumers or heterotrophs. Herbivores,

Carnivores and omnivores are the kinds of consumers.

Decomposers are organisms like bacteria which lead to the breakdown

Of dead animals and plants.

Energy is transferred from one living thing to another in the form of various food chains and many different food chains and many different food chains link up to form food webs. All the food webs are delicately balanced. So, if one link in the web is destroyed, all other organisms will be affected.
