CONJUNCTION (CONTD.)

(We have already discussed about coordinating conjunction, now today I will discuss about Subordinating conjunction.)

Subordinating conjunction

also join similar words, phrases

or elements exists in pairs.

Examples of some correlative conjunction:-

a. Either-or: This correlative conjunction pair is used to join

Positive items or options.

Example- Either I can stay at home or go to the party.

b. Neither- nor: This pair of correlative conjunction is used to join negative options or items Example- Neither she can speak in Hindi nor in English.

c. Not only but also-This correlative conjunction pair is similar to using 'and'.

Example: Not only he is my friend but also yours.

d. Whether- or This correlative

conjunction pair is similar to the

use of conjunction 'if'.It is used only to join clauses.

Example: She is unsure whether she should stay at home or go outside for work.

e. Both-and:This correlative conjunction pair is used to emphasise the true facts in a given sentence. Example:

He has both a car and a bike to visit anywhere.
