Topic: - problems in the periodistation of James mill.

- James Mill divides history on religious ground HINDU, MUSLIM, BRITISH (CHRISTIANS)
 BELOW
- Is it right to characterise and age only through the religion of the rulers of the time.
- Does the life religion and practice of other do not matters.

BELOW

- The periodistation is not trued justified.
- Because variety of faith existed simultaneously.

E.g. – when Delhi was ruled by Muslim rulers in South there were rulers of others faith also.

Problems in the periodistation by James mill.

- Due to <u>limitation of periodistation offered by James mill</u> moving away from <u>British classification</u>, historians have divided Indian history into:
- Ancient --- primitive old society.
- Mediaeval --- (transition period) neither ancient nor modern.
- Modern --- associated with growth of modern forces.
 - e.g. Science, democracy, liberty and equality.

NOTE: - MANY HISTORIANS REFERRED THIS MODERN PERIOD AS COLONIAL PERIOD.
