tense .Today, I am going to explain about negative and interrogative sentence in past continuous tense.

PAST CONTINUOUS TENSE

To form the negative and interrogative sentence in past continuous tense we use following form:

Negative sentence: subject+ was/were+not + v4 +object

For example: They were not reading story book in class yesterday.

Boys were not dancing when teacher came in class.

I was not running in the field when you rang me.

Interrogative sentence:

We form the interrogative sentence in past continuous tense in following sequence:

Helping verb(was/were) + subject + v4(fourth form of verb)+ object +?

For example: Were they reading book in the library last evening?

Was I running in the field when you rang me?
