WRITING SECTION

DESCRIPTION (People, Objects, Events)

Writing a paragraph to describe a person, an object or an event requires keen observation and knowledge. Description should be precise and objective.

Important Points

- 1. **Be true to facts**: All the facts are to be collected and verified, but producing a catalogue should be avoided. Remember that you have to put the facts and not indulge in free play of imagination.
- 2. Arrange the material: The facts should be arranged and presented in such a way that the reader is carried smoothly along. Coherence is a basic requirement
- 3. Keep to the sequence of events and other details: Description of events, persons and objects has an order which

must be kept to make your composition intelligible. It is advisable to jot down the points and then arrange them in a logical pattern.

4. Use short and simple sentences: Use short and simple sentences to bring clarity of expression. Passive voice is to be avoided. Usually, we use simple present tense in describing persons, objects and events but the simple past tense is used in describing the past events and personalities.
