A conjunction is nothing but words and phrases that stick phrases and clauses together to form a sentence.

In English language, it is

considered as connecting

words.

There are mainly three types of conjunctions-

A-Coordinating conjunctions- are single words that join similar words or phrases or elemennts.

- B. Subordinating conjunctions also join similar words, phrases or elements but exist in pairs
- C. Correlative conjunction-They are actually adverbs

That are used as conjunctions

A-Coordinating conjunction never come at the beginning of a sentence.

Conjunctions that we use

commonly in our day to day communication:-

1.For-It is used to sight a reason or purpose;

Example-I bought a pencil for my sister.

- 2. And-It connects one thing to another. She loves her brother and sister.
- 3.Nor- It is used to indicate

a negative idea to an already existing negative idea. Example-Neither the

blue cycle nor the red one I like to buy.

4.But- It is used to show a contrast between two items or ideas. Example-

He is poor but honest.

5.Or- It is used to present an alternative to an already present positive idea.

Example- Would you like to take tea or coffee?

6.Yet- It is used to introduce an idea that adds something to a previous idea and it's usually contrasting with

It. Example-I practice daily yet I couldn't put up a good show yesterday.

7.So-It is a conjunction that is used to indicate the effect or result of an occurance. Example-He worked hard so he scored good marks in the exam.
